

Finding Words© West Virginia

Finding Words© can be difficult for a child victimized by abuse. Conflicting emotions of fear and love for the perpetrator may cause a child to be reluctant to reveal abuse. If a child tries to speak of abuse, he or she may lack the verbal skills to adequately communicate the event to an adult.

Finding Words© can be difficult for a police officer, social worker or prosecutor who must speak to a child about abuse. In order to communicate competently with a child, the interviewer must be able to speak in a manner consistent with the child's linguistic and developmental abilities.

Finding Words© can be difficult for a child forced to tell a jury about abuse.

Finding Words© can be difficult for an investigator or prosecutor forced to defend an interview from an attack by defense counsel that the child was "lead" into making false accusations.

Finding Words© is an intensive five-day course in which students learn the necessary skills to conduct a competent, investigative interview of a child abuse victim using the CornerHouse forensic interview process.

Finding Words© is an interactive course, which combines lectures with demonstrations and hands on experience. Students will be required to interview a child about a non-abuse event and be critiqued by an expert forensic interviewer. Students will also conduct a 30 minute interview with an actor/actress playing the role of an abused child and will be critiqued on their performance.

Finding Words© is the ideal course for investigators and prosecutors seeking to enhance their ability to speak to and for abused children.

Finding Words© West Virginia is a **CHILDFIRST©** course taught by faculty trained and certified by NDAA and NCPTC in collaboration with CornerHouse, a nonprofit interagency child abuse evaluation and training center located in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Finding Words© West Virginia is limited to 40 students per session. Please be aware that this is an intensive course. The workshops are supplemented with homework assignments, which must be completed each night and each student will be given a written examination at the end of the course. Students who fail to attend all workshops, to complete homework, or to pass the examination will not be awarded a certificate of course completion. NCPTC supports multidisciplinary approach to child abuse. Registration will be confined to those who attend the training as a functioning multidisciplinary investigative team (MDT) who are currently employed within the State of West Virginia. **Only those who are practicing prosecutors, law enforcement officers, forensic interviewers and /or investigators employed at Child Advocacy Centers and a Child Protective Services workers are permitted to attend this course.**

Application to this course does not guarantee acceptance to this course.
